TRAIL ADVOCACY / LAND MANAGER LIAISON (Tony, Simon)

Trails concept plan (PV, DELWP and GORCAPA)

Sadly we were informed in late September that we didn't receive the 240k that the Shire had applied for to do the planning and assessments for our Trail Network Concept Plan. This was to add to the 60k that the Shire has already put aside

There are no more funding rounds available currently and having missed out twice the shire will have to reassess how it goes about trying to gain the funding.

The bit that could work out well is that with a little more funding (from the shire, the club or other sources) the 60k could allow the Shire to do all planning and assessments on Area 9 along with the scout camp loop and some other small pieces of the puzzle like the Southside link and the Hurst to Addis rd. link. If we, along with the Shire go down this path it could mean that within 12-24 months we might have all the gravity trails in Area 9, the scout camp loop and all of the Hurst Rd trails all formalised and connected into one network.

That could be a huge winner as it would mean that there is a really varied and quite long network that is all close to Anglesea and links together well. We would be able to work on the trails that we currently aren't able to legally. Also having the gravity trails formalised will ensure their future, allow us to tweak and maintain them and could gather more riders behind the club and involved in working bees.

There would also be no reason that the other trails west of Anglesea wouldn't still be on the agenda for future funding.

Tony has had discussions with the shire and they are keen to explore that avenue, but nothing will be set in concrete for awhile as the council will have to approve using the 60k in a slightly different way to what is planned and they are in caretaker mode for a while now.

MTB trails stakeholders group

GORCAPA's Great Ocean Road Trails Management Draft Strategy just finished its community consultation Our Trail network is heavily noted in the strategy which is great. Brett sent out encouragement to members and others to engage with the process. Hopefully the final dox will be out by Feb- March 2025

MTB trails advocacy group

No new updates. Last meeting was in late March. There are some actions from that meeting yet to be completed but all is going along well. .

Hurst Rd to Pt Addis link track

GORCAPA has made contact to see if the club is willing to enter into a MOU for us to maintain this trail once completed. We had already agreed to do this so said yes. Unsure of what will take place next.

Jarosite Rd bike lane update

Petition currently at 2541 signatures. Leann Tremul is organising this and is going to send to authorities soon. Consultation between the club, Leann and the Shire has resulted in the decision to send to all stakeholders but to ask for action directly from the Transport minister.

Jumps parks

- \$200k has just been approved to revamp Spring Valley Bike Park. Can publicise that. Aim is to start later this year. Will need plenty of dirt. Potential to work well with excavations associated with the swimming pool. The club to put out an expression of interest to riders to be involved with the planning and design of the park.
- Generally looking for good quality dirt to assist in maintenance. Committee members asked to let Tony know of any opportunities.
- Bob Pettitt reserve jumps park revamp through the week with approx.15 helpers. Open and going great with loads of use. Hose reel box has been installed making it easier for summer watering.
- Torquay North Area plans in place to look at a pump track for this area very early at this stage.

CHILD SAFE

Josh and Tony have had discussions around child safe procedures. We have both reviewed the <u>Auscycling Safeguarding Children and Young People Procedure</u>.

Main things to note from the best practice guidance (p16):

- Club should adopt Appendix 1 as our child safe commitment statement and make this available on the website
- Use table in Appendix 3 to decide who needs screening, interview and references for position. Currently Josh, Uli & Jess all are happy for the process to be followed so we can be compliant with the procedure
 - 5 mandatory questions must be asked
- x2 references must be sought, and x7 questions should be asked of the references
- Discussion with Tony who in the club is qualified to do this?
 - We should only be interviewing people we have already gotten to know for these positions.
 - Appendix 4 and 5 cover 'Red Flags' for the interview process. These can be used as a guide.
 - There is no reference in the document to state who needs to do the interview and follow up with references.
 - I suggest x2 office bearers +/- child safe officer.

Josh is happy to draft update the current Volunteer recruitment and screening procedure to include the above.

Action

- Suggest all committee review the <u>Auscycling Safeguarding Children and Young People Procedure</u> and consider the club using this as our policy discuss next month?
- Josh to update the Volunteer recruitment and screening procedure

Child safe issues arising - None to report

SKILLS CLINICS / COACHING

Upgrade tier 2b

Josh has investigated more into the 2b insurance upgrade which would allow for instructing of non-auscycling attendees. A quick summary of the insurance levels:

- 1: insurance for activities run by a volunteer instructor for the club for only auscycling members Free and what we currently have
- 2a: insurance for activities run by an instructor who is paid by the club to provide sessions for only auscycling members Free
- 2b: insurance for activites run by an instructor who can accept payment for the session from anyone who may or may not be an auscycling member \$300
- 3: same as 2b but for a company \$1200

However, there is reference in the <u>Auscycling upgrade document</u> that allows the instructor to volunteer and still maintain the 2b upgrade. There is an <u>online form</u> used to apply for the upgrade, and it is then considered by Auscycling. Josh will apply for the upgrade and see how it goes (after the increase in qualifications).

Qualification upgrades

Josh is due to complete PMBIA L1 on the 21-23 November, then the kids module 24th November. After this Josh will apply to AusCycling for a Recognition of Prior Learning to have his instructor level increased to Level 1. Josh has spoken to Jess and Uli about increasing their qualifications to L1 - they are both keen but time poor.

Once Josh achieves L1 we will only be able to have max 8 participants and remain within the A<u>uscycling Instructing</u> remit to do more advanced instructing and skills sessions on the blue trails around Hurst Road. Josh will discuss with Jess and Uli on how we can divide groups to cater for varying needs and stay within the remit and ratios.

Discussions with other clubs

Discussions with Marnie (You Yangs VP) and Sandy (Lysterfield Pres) last Sunday about sharing resources especially around kids events (like shuttle days) and instructing. Josh will arrange a meeting. ? include GMBC and others.

Skills clinics

No new adult skills clinics scheduled at this stage. Should we look at booking in a date with Cazz?

ADMINISTRATION (Damien)

Damien and Tony met to discuss our admin in regard to our volunteers info. Damien has started work to update our spreadsheets to be easy read and have only information that we need. These dox will also allow Damien to inform all volleys when any quals are due.

- Incoming mail 2 letters, Not for Profit ATO declaration reminder and a WWC renewal (interestingly our address was put down as 1 Hurst Rd did they make this up or do we use this address?)
- Repair kits are 90% ready, just need a few small multi tools to add in (they incl: 29" tube, CO2, tyre levers all strapped together) there'll be one of each kit per bag, leads can pick an choose what they want to take. Ky suggestion to add space blanket to each kit.
- Slow start with the wwc and skills database but progressing.

OTHER BUSINESS

- **AGM** Initial date announcement has been sent to all members via email. Need to finalise the Annual Report. Brett or Luke to generate report.
- Trail work social post encouraging riders to move any sticks they come across on the trails.
- Model Rules Investigation needed to look at our Model rules. We currently use the general one but GMBC had some wording of their own. it may be helpful to do the same. This is especially so as we are often asked for not for profit status certificate but we don't have one. Can include these words in our Model Rules. Nick will look further into this.
- Jumps Jam at A'sea bike park Idea for Halloween weekend from Jake. Tony explored further with AusCycling but it was difficult to get clear answers and eventually deemed too many requirements to make it practical. Jake informed.
- Auscycling Is anyone interested in being the liaison role with A/C? Andrew is potentially interested.
- **Sponsorship** Steve from Hendrys has offered to fund a system to give prizes / incentives to club members. Tony has established with Steve that this is likely to be focussed at rewarding volunteers who have provided consistent support to the club. Tony will follow up further with Steve.
- Adaptive Trails Damien (volunteers for DWA) suggested that opening communications with DWA could be
 undertaken to establish if any trails could be formally designated as adaptive suited. This may open up other
 avenues for funding to ensure trials can be opened and maintained as suitable for this community. Committee
 is supportive of Damien approaching DWA to initiate talks. Andrew also noted his interest in this area, and has
 some contacts and background information which can be shared on the requirements for adaptive
 trails/cycling. Update: Damien has touched base with DWA about accessible trails partnership etc, they have
 board elections next week, so hopefully more after that.
- First Aid Stocktake First aid kits for ride leads are done (incl: snake bandage, crepe bandages, gauze and other small items)- I'll sort a way of getting them to the guide/leads for ride days along with the pack and repairs kits (perhaps a collection bin on my front deck?)
- **Discussion on regularity of c'tee meetings.** Decision made to continue monthly for now for fear of losing momentum. We could have every 2nd one limited to 1hr only and just go through the super important areas. Rotating Committee mtg days discussion suggested. Further discussion at the next meeting to establish most preferred mtg days.
- Google docs instead of Dropbox. Does dropbox just need a clean up?
